



# Grain-Based Desserts in the Child and Adult Care Food Program

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Beginning **October 1, 2017**, grain-based desserts will no longer be creditable in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) meal patterns. USDA defines “grain-based desserts” as those items denoted with superscripts 3 and 4 in Exhibit A in USDA’s Food Buying Guide for Child Nutrition Programs. USDA revised Exhibit A in policy memorandum CACFP 16-2017, dated June 30, 2017. CACFP operators should refer to Exhibit A as found in Attachment 1 of CACFP 16-2017 when determining which items are considered grain-based desserts.

## The following is the list of designated grain-based desserts as listed in Exhibit A:

- Cookies (all types, including vanilla wafers)
- Pie crusts (dessert pies, cobblers, fruit turnovers)
- Doughnuts
- Granola bars, breakfast bars, cereal bars
- Sweet rolls
- Toaster pastries
- Cake
- Coffee cake
- Brownies
